~PLS Knapps Back to the Past~

Clink, clink. The unmistakable music coming from flint knappers making paleo tools and arrowheads. Since the beginning of time, man has made tools by using reasoning and logic to solve complex problems. Making arrowheads is far more advanced than a chimpanzee fashioning a twig to pull ants out of a nest. The shaping of rocks, known as lithic reduction, involves complex issues of geometry and geology. Lithic reduction is the process of using blows or pressure to shape stones or rocks from their natural state into tools or weapons. Archaeologists can frequently identify tribes by the precise style of their tools and the reduction techniques they used.

We've all seen flint knappers at the shows; sometimes they charge the public for rudimentary instruction. Not so this weekend. Members from the Pasadena Lapidary Society and the Anaheim Searchers attended a field trip to Chilao School, about 50 minutes from La Canada.

PLS Knapps Back to the Past

Here, at the nonprofit Redbird Visions Foundation, we attended the Chilao Knap-in. The Knap-in was an informal gathering of volunteer paleo tool specialists who instructed us on how to fashion our obsidian finds in usable arrowheads, scrapers, and spear tips.

PLS member Betty Stradford even helped instructor Gary Pickett to make this beautiful flint spear tip.

Searchers Steve K and Virgil also attended this trip and both fashioned arrowheads out of striped translucentgray obsidian.

Though most of the rockhounds used obsidian, junior PLS member Danny gleaned some flint shards and made workable arrowheads. He was so excited to do things with the men that he forgot about the small cuts on his hands. It was definitely a growing up activity for him and I'm proud to be a witness to it.

As the afternoon heated up, many members

beat a hasty retreat to the air conditioned visitor's center, where docent Nel Graham amazed us with her knowledge of local geology and extensive mineral display.



The knapping ended around 6:30 PM, but that was just the start of the festivities. We had a fabulous pot luck dinner followed by an evening hike to a nearby rock quarry. We didn't find the quarry, but the bats and mosquitoes found us and we knew it was time to hit the road. As dusk turned to darkness, we reminisced on the day's events and the tools that we made. Who knows, maybe someday, archaeologists may classify rockhounds based on the techniques used to make our own private collection of paleo tools.









General Meeting-August 16, 2022

The August general meeting at The Santa Anita Church, Colorado Street, Arcadia, CA, will feature a talk entitled "Geology from 30,000 feet above." The presentation will focus on large-scale landscape geology. First, we have a six-inch trim saw body. This is a "handyman special." I was able to run it at speed and the bearings are quiet. Includes saw body and pulleys. You add everything else including the blade. The good news is that it is only \$20. Secondly, we have a wonderful muscle

multiplier for those who want more/bigger rocks than they can carry to the car. This is a travois with a big pneumatic tire, two sturdy handles and a strong net. Should work on moderately rough ground or better. It is home made, but well made. Asking just \$40, probably less than the cost of parts to make your own.
